DROPPING CLASSES IN THE SUMMER

Summer classes vary in length, and the drop deadline depends upon the length of the class. To be absolutely sure, check with your advisor. Here is the drop schedule as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog:

<u>If Classes Meet for</u>	<u>Deadline for Withdrawal to Receive Full Refund</u>	<u>Deadline to Withdraw</u>
13-16 weeks	2 nd week	8 th week plus 1 day
9-12 weeks	2 nd week	6 th week
8 weeks	2 nd week	4 th week
7 weeks	1 st week	4 th week
4-6 weeks	1 st week	3 rd week
2-3 weeks	1 st day	1 st week

PREREQUISITES

It is your responsibility to make sure you have the prerequisites for classes you enroll in. In many cases, you must pass the prerequisite with a grade of C or better. If you register for math for next semester, but fail to earn a C in the prerequisite math class this semester, it is your responsibility to drop the next class.

Closed Classes - - - Waitlisting - - - Closed Class Cards

If you put your name on a waitlist because a class you want it closed, you will get into it only if someone else drops. Therefore, if you cannot be first or second on the list, it is better to find another course to enroll in. Closed class cards are given out by the department or the instructor of the class. They allow registration in a course that is full and are processed in the advisement office. Some instructors give out closed class cards and some do no. Don't count on it.
