

BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION FOR THE HEALTH PREPROFESSIONAL COMMITTEE

For each area, please explain your activities/employment, being as specific as possible, and using a chronological order. You may wish to use a combination of both a listing and descriptive paragraph format. Use outline heading for each topic, then list activities as subheadings.

- I. **Organized Activities.** Please comment on campus activities, including off-campus activities, varsity athletics, intramural participation, volunteer service activities, etc., giving for each the degree of participation, any office held, the time frame (for example, August 2002-December 2002), and the average number of hours spent per week or per month in the activity. Shadowing experience should also be discussed, including type of professional observed, examples of what was observed, and approximate number of total hours spent observing.
- II. **Unorganized Activities.** Please comment on hobbies, recreational activities and other uses of your time, giving for each the degree of involvement, the average number of hours spent per week or per month in the activity, and any new skills or interests that have been developed.
- III. **Employment.** Please comment on jobs held during the school year and give the average number of hours spent per week working. Explain what you have done with your summers and the degree to which employment has been necessary to finance your education, support a family, etc.
- IV. **Typical Week.** Currently, what is your typical week like? How many hours per week do you study? Spend with volunteer activities? Employment, etc.? Please summarize this information briefly. Please DO NOT give your daily schedule.
- V. **Academic Work.** Please discuss honors section, awards, honor societies, scholarships or any other academic honors that you have received. You may also use this section to list special research projects and the time spent doing them, and to explain any peculiarities in your record.
- VI. **Career Choice/Personal Statement Essay.** Please comment on when, why and how you decided to become a physician or other health care professional. As best you can, describe your motivation to pursue a career in medicine or other professional field. Discuss those experiences that have influenced you in your decision. You may want to bring in your long-term goals and/or personal philosophy. This section should be approximately one page in length. Use a block paragraph style (one space in between paragraphs, do not indent).
- VII. **Please attach a recognizable picture of yourself.** If you use a passport photo, please let them know you need to smile! Digital pictures (that are headshots) are fine. **Do not staple**, as the biographical information will be attached to a grade transcript (the advisor will obtain this), list of required preprofessional courses (handout), graph of your science and overall GPA, summary of comments, and checklist portions of your evaluations. The biographical information, picture, and list of preprofessional courses handout should be turned in at least one week before your interview.
